- 3. Status of action items from last meeting (Corinna Bork)
 - June PAC minutes were not approved last month due a question whether it was posted on the website. It was posted and the minutes have now been approved.
- 4. Treasurer's Report (Carly Philip)
 - Incoming: \$423 received from Olivers' Labels fundraiser. RBC grant of \$1000 received. School Swag, over 100 items ordered, raised \$1200. Waiting for school supply kickback, typically not till a few months later.
 - Main spending in October: Library \$1258, Safeteen \$898, upcoming performance by Lakota Performing Arts \$900

- 5. Principals' Report (Spencer Kelly absent due to illness, report read by Corinna Bork)
 - *Basketball:* for Grade 7s, still awaiting word from Sutherland may run it without them. One school dropped out due to lack of players.
 - *Skiing:* buses expensive, plus increase in staffing costs for coverage. The costs range from \$375 to \$405 (per child.
 - They need a minimum of 70-100 students depending on program. To keep the cost at \$300 per student (\$50 increase from previous year), PAC would need to contribute \$10,000 per year not an option at this point.
 - The option using the Seymour Mountain shuttles from Parkgate was looked into and were found to be not workable.
 - The last option would be to have a parent run program after school, would require volunteer.
 - *Cell Phones:* becoming a problem as they are big distractions, especially for older students. Brooksbank is trying to coordinate a response that is common across the family of schools
 - *Conferences:* November 19th and 21st, 12:10 dismissals
 - student/family/teacher conference format
 - next newsletter will have information on how you can prepare for the conferences

- *Centennial Theatre Concert:* more information out next week. Tickets will be sold online. Will be on December 10th, the day before the Jingle Mingle.
