

#### Brooksbank Elementary School PAC Meeting Minutes – June 4, 2014

In the regular account, we have \$29,520 and in Gaming we have \$100.26.

## **Budget for approval:**

The original budget was \$26,000. In the 2014/2015 school year, there will be no Parents Night event on school property, only the Halloween and Jingle Mingle Family events as the major source of our fundraising, along with Hot Lunch. There may be a smaller parents night held at another venue, simply for social purposes.

Lisa Stirling will send the 2013/2014 budget out via class reps.

Some items approved for purchase for 2014/2015 include self-regulation and resilience resources for children who require different learning tools. Examples of these include standing desks, hockey stools, fidget packs and noise-cancelling headphones. Mark Landry, a registered occupational therapist, helped to provide valuable input on the selection of these items.

Other approved items include in-class headsets, surround sound and sound field systems. There will be two kinds in use in the open area classrooms.

\$10,000 contingency term deposit cannot be touched.

Gaming grant submission allows \$20/per student enrolled. Deadline for application is June 30<sup>th</sup> 2014. These funds, once obtained, can be used towards very specific purposes such as guest speakers and materials, supplies and special events that benefit the school as a whole.

# Principal's Report:

It is announced that both Principal Arlene Martin and Vice-Principal Spencer Kelly will be staying at Brooksbank for the 2014/2015 school year.

School organization is a primary focus at the moment, with the school population growing and 2 additional divisions being added in the fall. Top Drawer (all-day) Daycare is now vacating the building, however their before and after school care is planned to continue within two classrooms.

The reclaimed classrooms will become the second of two open areas, offering 2 open classes and one closed classroom.

2014/2015 is slated to offer either 2 or 3 full kindergarten classrooms. Current enrolment for grades K-7 for September is 380 versus 302 in September of 2012.

The apple trees planted at the main entrance to the school (donated to us by Evergreen Nurseries) have been vandalized. 3 of the 6 trees have been uprooted and are unlikely to recover. Staff and volunteers have worked to replant and water them. Volunteers to help water them over the summer break would be greatly appreciated.

Outdoor School (Grades 2-3): Administration and staff are working together to find a solution to allow students in grades 2 and 3 to continue to attend Outdoor School in Brackendale next week, but are finding some difficulty with the strict 45 minute lockout rule. There are several different ideas on the table, however, the most likely solution will be to offer a one-day trip, heading up early and returning by 3:45 the same day.

Grade 2's entering Grade 3 will be offered the opportunity to attend the 3-day camp in 2015 as planned. Starting next year, only Grade 3's will be offered this program.

Track and Field went ahead on Tuesday as planned, despite the rotating strike action.

#### DPAC Report: Chandra Junck

The DPAC held their AGM for approval of NVPAC policies and procedures and offered a list of grants available for application by individual schools. Grants can be used towards guest speakers. There is a limit to the number of grants a school can apply for at the start of the school year. After April 1<sup>st</sup>, a school may apply for the remainder of unclaimed grants on a first come, first serve basis. These grants also include a \$150 Guest Speaker Grant, which tends to be the most popular.

There was a parent survey sent out via email and was available from May 21<sup>st</sup>-31<sup>st</sup> 2014. There was a very low response this year, and the deadline has now been reached.

The BCCPAC AGM was May 31<sup>st.</sup>



# Parent Event Update: Catherine Stride

It was a very successful and well-attended event this year. All members of the PAC, along with parent and teacher volunteers worked quickly to set-up and clean up afterwards.

There is a proposal to form a committee in the future to assist with the planning and running of the event, to ease the responsibilities on the part of the PAC Chair. Some great feedback and suggestions for things to improve on include the placement of the games and photo booth, so that they might be more central, and therefore more popular.
