**Treasurer's Report:** Lisa Stirling. In the regular account, we have \$18,420.47 and in gaming we have \$100.06.

The spring plant Sale was a success, with thanks to the volunteers for their help with the distribution of plants. There were several leftover plants, due to the fact that we are required to order by the dozen. The profit from this year's sale was \$2000.00.

Purdy's Chocolate Fundraiser earned \$312.76 in profits.

Next month's meeting discussions will include a staff wish list and budget approval.

#### **Principal's Report:**

#### School Fees for the 2014/2015 School Year are as follows:

Kindergarten parents pay \$40.00 and supplies are provided for the classroom. Special project fees will not exceed \$20 per student. Grades 2-7 will be required to purchase a student planner for \$9.00 and there will be other fees for certain grades throughout the year for special enrichment activities such as tennis, dance and gymnastics (\$15) and music (\$10).

#### PAC Parent Fundraiser Request.

Currently 23 staff members have confirmed that they will attend the May 23<sup>rd</sup> event, while others are not yet certain. The priority for the funds raised is for classroom FM systems (3) to try for part of the year, and then continue with further purchases.

Sensory Processing Enhancements (e.g. Tennis balls for primary class chair legs) will also be purchased with these funds.

Over the next year, we will investigate the best option for enhancing the gym sound system. A Bose sound system will be purchased for the gym later in May.

#### Field Trip Support:

On behalf of the families who have received support from the PAC for field trips, including Outdoor School, thank you for including this in the annual budget.



# School Calendar:

District-approved calendar is attached. Brooksbank school-based professional development days are as follows: Monday, September 22, 2014 and Friday, June 5, 2015. ## Code of Conduct:

- Team of staff members attended a 2-day workshop on Positive Behaviour Support.
- This encouraged a review of our code of conduct.
- "Compassion in our thoughts, words and actions"
- Not a distancing from our current code of conduct, but rather a re-framing with more positive and warm language that captures the efforts we make to increase the sense of belonging within our classrooms, school and community.
- Still addresses the expectation of respect, responsibility and safety, but the language chance carries an expectation of the consideration of others.
- For the past three years we have been approaching situations of conflict/behaviour from the perspective of encouraging students to consider how their actions have impacted another's sense of belonging.
- Explicit teaching will center on understanding "compassion".
