## Code of Conduct

- Team of staff members attended a 2 day workshop on Positive Behaviour Support
- Encouraged a review of our code of conduct
- Review and revision
- "Compassion in thought, speech and action"
- Not a distancing from current code of conduct, but rather a reframing with more positive and warm language that captures the efforts we make to increase the sense of belonging within our classrooms, school and community
- Still addresses an expectation of respect, responsibility and safety, but the language change carries an expectation of the consideration of others
- For the past 3 years, we have been approaching situations of conflict / behavior from a perspective of encouraging students to consider how their actions have impacted an others' sense of belonging
- Explicit teaching will center around understanding 'compassion'

Apple Trees: Evergreen has donated a total of 6 young apple trees to be planted along the walkway at the front entrance of the school.

Guest Speaker: Cheryl Wahl of Sutherland Secondary School's PAC presented information on the annual Sutherland Gala. ## Earth Day: Nicole Cooke

April 22, 2014. A rough plan is to include Grades 2-6 and will require 8-12 parent volunteers. If more than 20 volunteers are able to help, the activities can be offered to the Grade 1's as well. The Grade 7's are choosing to opt out of this program, to focus on curriculum work.

Ideas for stations include an Energy Scavenger Hunt, chalk drawings, murals, and games. There will be 3 sessions throughout the day. A suggestion has been to have a "Dining in the Dark" theme for the lunch period, with class and hall lights turned off. Volunteers will be requested through individual class reps and each division will require a minimum of 3 parents and one teacher.

## Round Table:

Erin $\mathbf{H}$ : Raised some concern over the fallen trees in the lower ravine behind the school, some of which have partially covered the walking path. Mrs. Martin has offered to have the District look into the matter.

Robin, a new Brooksbank parent (welcome Robin): Had some concerns regarding the Health Board's lice statistics.

He also inquired about the lunchtime routine, in particular, why children go out to play instead of eating first, and how this may affect both the children's eating time and time to adequately wash hands.

Mrs. Martin explained that after careful consideration, the NVSD decided that the children would benefit more by playing first, to get rid of excess energy as well as increase their appetites, so that when it is time to go inside, they are more likely to eat more of their lunches and are also more able to focus on the afternoon's schedule. As for hand washing, teachers in kindergarten classes ask children to wash hands before meals, however, the school staff depends on proper hand washing reminders to come from parents, as there simply isn't enough time to monitor so many children's hand washing habits.
